Please include the book's title, author, and publisher, your name, grade level taught/field of expertise, and city or school board.

Books will be delivered to the reviewer in an electronic format. Reviewers may keep the PDF versions of the books sent for review.

**Word count:** 300-400 words

### Deadlines:

- Picture books, Children's Nonfiction, and Adult Nonfiction (includes resources for children): **2 weeks** from the time you receive the book
- Novels for Children's, Teens, and Young Adult (includes graphic novels and biographies): **3 weeks** from the time you receive the book
- Professional Development Resource: **4 weeks** from the time you receive the book

To meet our deadlines, we need you to do the same, so please endeavour to do so.

We are looking for constructive commentary on the books provided. All reviews will be subject to assessment by editorial staff prior to acceptance.
